School board election set for April 11

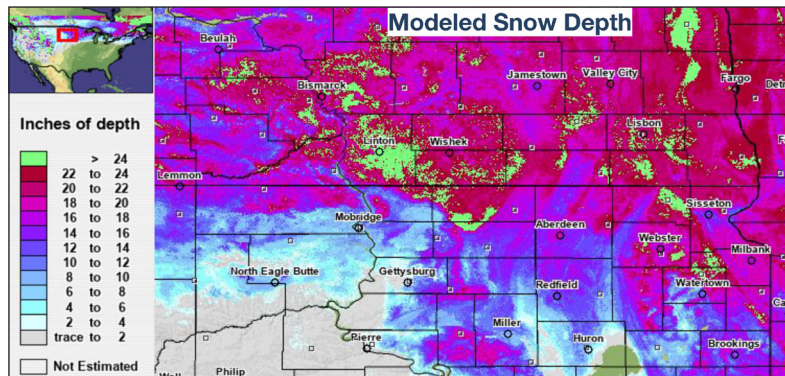
Three candidates are running for two seats on the board of the Frederick Area School District.

Incumbents Jonathan Ellwein of Barnard and Eric Sumption of Frederick are running for re-election. Derik Bretsch of Frederick would be a newcomer to the board if elected.

The term for each of the two seats is three years.

The election will be held Tuesday, April 11, and polls will be open from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. at the Frederick Community Center and the Westport Town Hall.

If polls cannot open due to weather, the election may be postponed one week, according to a notice published by the school.

Winter still hanging on

The calendar says spring has arrived, but a look out the window suggests there's a fair amount of winter to get through yet.

More than 55 inches of snow have fallen at the Aberdeen airport so far this winter, according to Megan Mulford of the National Weather Service in Aberdeen. An observer near Columbia measured the snow depth at 22 inches on March 22. While there are no observers sending in measurements from our area, a NWS model of current snow depth in the Frederick area shows a range from about 14 to 22 inches.

At this point, usual spring activities, such as track meets and planting, still appear to be a ways off.

"It's tough to say how fast the snow will melt given the amount

we have, and we have been dealing with colder-than-average temperatures and will continue to do so through early April," Mulford said.

There is also some risk of flooding when temperatures eventually do warm up. According to a March 23 outlook by the Advanced Hydrologic Prediction Service, the chance of moderate flooding along the James River near Columbia is more than 50 percent, and the chance of minor flooding along the Elm River near Westport is more than 50 percent. The chances of moderate flooding look to start April 8 and are greatest between April 15 and 29.

The service doesn't have a prediction for the Maple River through Frederick.

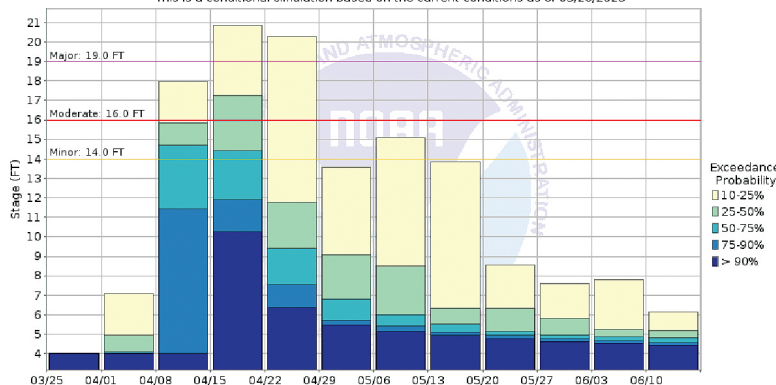
Titans make it to SoDak 16

Team achieves this year's goals

The Leola/Frederick Titan Girls Basketball team wrapped up their 2022-23 season and finished with a record of 16-7. As is the case with most other seasons, there were ups and downs, but definitely more of the former than the latter. The group continued to build and improve from previous seasons, and with a first-ever appearance in the SoDak16, we will no doubt be setting our sights and goals a bit higher next year.

We were fortunate to have three of our players recognized within the conference this year. Laura Sumption and Sofi Losure were named 1st Team All-Conference, and Chloe Arneson was named to the 2nd team. Laura was also recognized as Co-MVP of the conference.

Entering the season, our three primary goals were to win the Lake Region Conference, win 15 games, and make it to the SoDak16. We accomplished all three of those goals and look forward to building on this season's successes as we look toward next year.

We won our season opener at Sunshine Bible and then sat for two weeks thanks to Mother Nature. We then traveled to Hoven to face Potter County right before Christmas break and lost a tough one by three points. It would be 46 days before we would lose again, and for the second season in a row, we made it through the month of January going a perfect 11-0. Our first game in February would see us clinch the conference title with a win over Warner and move our record to 13-1, but we would lose four straight games in one week's time after that. We hosted North Central for Senior Night in Leola, and we were able to escape with a 60-58 victory. After rescheduling our Waubay/Summit game three

different times, we were not able to get it in, so we picked up Dupree on short notice and made the trip out west for our final regular season contest. We came up short and finished the regular season with a 14-6 record.

We entered the post-season as the #2 seed in our region and hosted Aberdeen Christian in Frederick. We got off to a quick start and our pressure forced several turnovers, which led to easy baskets. The score was 28-4 at the half and ended up 50-13. We then played #3 seed Northwestern at the Webster Armory for a chance to advance to the SoDak16. We led by four points after a quarter and by eight points at the half. The lead was ten going into the final quarter and Northwestern tried to make a run, cutting the lead to six and having a couple possessions to trim that even more, but they weren't able to do so, and we were able to pull away for the 46-33 victory.

We traveled to Huron March 2 for our SoDak16 contest versus the top seed in the state, Wolsey/Wessington. After we took an early 4-0 lead in the contest, our opponent scored the next 11 points to lead 11-4 after the first quarter. We continued to struggle offensively, scoring seven points in the second quarter while giving up 22, and we trailed 33-11 at the half, en route to a 58-23 defeat to end our season.

We are only three years removed from an 0-21 season and have seen steady improvement since, winning five games two years ago, 9 games last year, and 16 games this past season. Alyx Hoffman was the lone senior on the floor for us this year (Lacey Westphal was lost to a season-ending injury at the end of volleyball), so there is good reason for the girls to be excited for what next year could potentially bring for the program. I know the girls will continue to work hard and put the time in and when it comes time for the season to start next year, we will be ready!
